Discuss

Talk through your thoughts.

Create

- Trickster tales are meant to be told. Choose one, practice retelling it giving personality to each character and when ready try out your storytelling talents on a friend or family member.
- Think of a story that gets retold in your family or among your friends. Create your story using this graphic novel format.

Imagine

Use your imagination to explore.

- These stories are all Native American tales. Which ones seem familiar? See if you can find other cultures who have similar tales. What is alike? What is different?
- Notice that the author consulted with Native Americans in the development of this text. Imagine how they may have felt when approached by a white author asking for help in creating an authentic collection of Native American myths.
